

Rhonda and I have owned our 2016 Corvette since December of 2020. Just like all of you when you buy a new car, we had to contact an insurance company to have our vehicle covered. At the time, we decided to stay with our current insurance company - "Jake from SF" - because we had a "bundled" policy with home and multi cars. After joining SLO Vettes, I was informed that the Corvette National Car Museum offered vehicle insurance for Corvettes. I contacted NCM at that time and received a quote from them and there was no financial advantage to making the switch to NCM three years ago, so we remained with "Jake from SF".

Over the last three years, our six month premium on the Corvette continued to increase where once again I needed to check out NCM Insurance. In a few weeks I had contacted NCM and I learned that as of January 1st, 2024, NCM was no longer insuring vehicles in the state of California. However, NCM provided a quote for us through Hagerty Insurance. Even though our quote was with Hagerty Insurance, my contact was still with the folks at NCM. After a couple of phone calls and texting pictures of my car to NCM, Rhonda and I made the decision to make the change from "Jake from SF" to Hagerty which will save us a few hundred dollars a year. The process was fast and easy. The only thing that was different is that I had to provide a dollar amount of what my Corvette is worth in case the car is not repairable after an accident. This seemed a little weird to me.

I bring up this insurance topic because one of you may be in the same situation that we were in with premiums continuing to increase. Sometimes getting a reminder is all anyone needs. The quoting process took about five minutes. It may be worth five minutes of your time. #### **Museum News**

#### **NCM 2024 Hall of Fame Nominees**

The Corvette Hall of Fame announced its 2024 class of members-elect, who will be formally inducted during the Anniversary

Celebration on August 31, 2024. For nearly three decades, the Corvette Hall of Fame has recognized personalities who have distinguished themselves through their accomplishments alongside their high standards of integrity and character, reflecting the reputation of Corvette and the National Corvette Museum. Each year, a leader is inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame from one of three categories: Racing, GM/Chevrolet, and Enthusiast.



**Racing** – Oliver Gavin & Jan Magnussen, Corvette Racing Drivers.

Oliver Gavin and Jan Magnussen became two of Corvette Racing's brightest stars during a decorated run together in the 2000's and 2010's. They won Le Mans every year from 2004 to 2006, as well as Sebring once and /road Atlanta twice. Together, Gavin and Magnussen have won eight championships driving for Corvette Racing, with 51 wins by Gavin and 34 by Magnussen.

# **Chevrolet** – Tadge Juechter, Corvette Chief Engineer

In 2006, Tadge Juechter became the fifth chief engineer of the Corvette. He has worked on five generations of Corvettes. He led the development of the C7 and made a special point to redesign the interior of the Corvette. The mid-engine C8 is the first Corvette Juechter got to create from the ground up. During the NCM Michelin Bash, Juechter announced his upcoming retirement after 47 years with GM.

**Enthusiast** – Richard Prince, Automobile Photographer

Richard Prince is a leading automobile photographer whose connections span the globe. While running a Corvette restoration business in 1992, Prince began writing a column for 'Vette Magazine. He was selected to be the official photographer for Corvette Racing. Prince's photography has appeared in over 400 publications. In 1999, Prince published his first book, a C3 restoration and technical guide. More recent works include Corvette 70 Years: The One and Only and Corvette Stingray: The Mid-Engine Evolution.

Just a personal note – I learned something while reading about Richard Prince's accomplishments. I really enjoy a Q&A column in every issue of Corvette Magazine entitled "Tech Nerd" and it is the first text I read when I get my new copy. It is a great source of information on how to fix almost any issue perplexing a Corvette owner. The true identity of the Tech Nerd has always been a mystery until now when I see that Prince writes that column.

# NCM Becomes a Blue Star Museum Celebrating Military Families

The National Corvette Museum announced it will join museums nationwide in the Blue Star Museums initiative, a program that provides free admission to currently serving U.S. military personnel and their families this summer. Becoming a Blue Star Museum expands the Museum's already strong support of both active and past service members to events such as Vets and Vettes and free admission during the month of May (Military Appreciation Month).

## Important Dates for 2024 and 2025 Model Runs

The last date for ordering a 2024 Corvette was May 28th and the last day of 2024 production is scheduled for July 12th. It appears that there are just two order cycles left for the model year as well. There will be a May Cycle 2 and June Cycle 1, and then the June Cycle 2 ordering is for the 2025s.

The 2025 model year is scheduled to start on Monday, July 15th. Dealers can begin to add preliminary orders to the order system (status 1100) on July 9th. The 2025 Corvette Order Guide is expected to drop on Monday, June 10th.

Chevrolet is canceling these seven exterior colors. Amplify Orange, Accelerate Yellow, Silver Flare Hypersonic Gray, Carbon Flash Metallic, Ceramic Matrix Gray, and Cacti. #### Corvette Paced the Indy 500 Again

I really enjoyed watching the 2024 Corvette E-Ray coupe pace car driven by Major League Baseball legend, Ken Griffey, Jr. as he led the entire field of racers to the start of Indianapolis 500. It is interesting to note and probably no coincidence that the E-Ray was selected as IndyCar racing is switching to hybrid power in their cars later this summer. This marked the 35th time a Chevy has served as the pace car since 1948 and the 21st time for a Corvette since 1978.

Can you imagine that? The only other car with a gas engine, the Chevy Malibu, will be discontinued this upcoming November. After that, Chevy will only make trucks, SUVs, and vans with gas engines. # Michelin to Use Rice in Their Tire Recipe silica.

Here's an interesting tidbit. Silica, normally derived from sand, is an important ingredient when it comes to making tires. Tire engineers tweak the silica content of tires to

increase rolling resistance and in turn, efficiency. Silica content can also affect a tire's resistance to hits and chips, among other properties. Michelin, in it's efforts to make more sustainable products, has been searching for alternative supplies of silica.

Tons of rice are gown every year - 670 million metric tones to be more exact. Nearly a quarter of that figure, by weight, is the rice husk, or the hard "shell" covering the part we eat - and it usually goes to waste. Why does Michelin car about rice husks? #### Recipes

Who doesn't like chocolate? Since brought back to Europe from the New World, it has been at the top of the "My favorite dessert" list in one form or another. This month we are offering up a recipe we got when visiting old friends who live in Holloway's Beach, just north of Cairns, Australia. We think you will like it if you try it!

#### **Cinnamon Chocolate Mousse**

From the Cairns, Australia, Weekend Post Weekender, February 7, 2004

#### What you Need

3 egg yolks
1/4 cup sugar
8 oz. semi-sweet chocolate
1 cup (8 ounces) + 2 Tbs whipping cream
6 egg whites
1tsp ground cinnamon
12 small ramekins\*

#### What to Do

Beat the egg yolks and sugar together until frothy.

Melt the chocolate and 2 Tbs of the whipping cream in the microwave or in a double boiler over low heat on top of the stove. (Don't panic! This mixture will probably be very tick, with a dough-like consistency).

While beating the egg yolk and sugar mixture, add small amounts of the chocolate to gradually warm the egg yolks until you have used about 1/4 of the melted chocolate. Combine the remaining chocolate with the warmed egg yolk mixture, beat to combine thoroughly, and set aside.

Whip the remaining whipping cream (1 cup) in a separate bowl. In another bowl, whip the egg whites until stiff. Add whipped cream to the chocolate mixture. Beat to combine. Fold in egg whites.

Pour resulting mixture into small ramekins or custard dishes. Refrigerate for at least four hours. Dust with cinnamon. Garnish with a leaf or sprig of mint, if desired.

\*Note: the recipe fills 12 small ramekins to the top rim, each holding between 1/3 cup and 1/2 cup of the mixture, or 6-8 larger individual ramekins or dishes. (It's very rich, so I generally use the smaller ramekins or, when using large dishes, I don't fill them completely. Also, please don't run out and buy ramekins if you don't have them already. The mousse can be chilled in a large bowl and spooned out in individual servings garnished with a dusting of cinnamon around the plate.



#### **Corvette Tech Talk**

Art MacCarley and Don Allen Season 2 Episode 5:



Keeping your Corvette clean and shiny shouldn't be limited to just the outside and the interior. Having a sparkling engine compartment demonstrates you really take good care of your car. Dust and grime can conceal leaks and corrosion and your engine might run a little hotter and your belts could wear out a little faster. If your engine looks like it has never been cleaned, a service tech

making a repair could think you are not particular about quality.

While your beauty probably doesn't look quite as bad as the neglected LS engine in this photo, any accumulation of grime or oil residue is a magnet for dust and dirt. It is easy to clean up and make it appear new without too



much effort and no need for expensive equipment. You just need to follow a few suggestions to avoid any issues following the cleaning.

Starting with the 1997 C5 and all newer Corvette engines, GM used one ignition coil per cylinder so you can clean the engine without worrying about water damage. All earlier Corvettes had distributors which could be troublesome during engine cleaning if any moisture got into the coil or distributor cap.

You don't need a pressure washer or a steam cleaner – just a garden hose will remove most all the krud if you first spray the engine and surrounding area with a good engine cleaner. You can find several good ones either on Amazon or your favorite auto parts store. It might take a couple of applications to get everything and you may need to agitate the stubborn stuff to break it loose.

Do your best to only direct a strong spray from your hose at the engine block or cylinder heads. A fan spray is more appropriate for other surfaces. Compressed air or a yard blower will help remove water from tight spaces to help prevent corrosion. A high-pressure washer or steam cleaner will cause condensation and can force water into places it shouldn't be, making it difficult to remove.

The engine must be at ambient temperature with no heat buildup to achieve the best results. Either park your Corvette overnight, where the engine cleaning will occur or move it early and let it completely cool. All electrical components and connectors are weatherproof, so direct water will not cause corrosion or damage. Electronic components can condense moisture internally when cold water hits the surface if the engine is even slightly warm.

We suggest you cover the cowl, fenders, and anything else close by or rinse them off ASAP. You don't want any overspray on the paint.





For a deep clean, you will want to remove plastic engine covers before applying cleaner. You might also remove the air filter intake duct and cover the throttle body opening with duct tape. Heck, while you are at it you might as well check the air filter element or service a high-performance washable element. Otherwise, cover the air intake opening to prevent water intrusion. If

you do remove the air intake, you may be surprised by the debris built up on the radiator and A/C condenser. You can flush out radiator debris with the garden hose. Don't forget to clean all of the covers as well. Corrosion may begin if water is under the engine covers.

If the underside of the hood is dirty, you might want to clean it first by using some car wash soap and water. Avoid soaking the under-hood liner panel. Apply cleaner to the engine and entire compartment. Spray the engine with cleaner, including the inner fenders and radiator area. Apply cleaner as many times as necessary; however, the cleaner won't be as effective if the engine is wet. Keep all areas moist with cleaner until you are ready to rinse, approximately ten minutes. There aren't any coated components that will discolor, so citric acid cleaners should work without causing damage.

Silicone helps repel water and does an excellent job of cleaning plug wires. Once cleaning is complete, apply spray silicone lubricant on a clean cloth and then wipe on the plug wires and spray the hood hinges. You can apply some high-temperature grease on the hood latches so they operate smoothly.

Remember, you'll want to keep things cool to avoid plastic part damage. Keep a water hose handy to rinse the exterior if any cleaning product gets on the paint. Washing in the direct sunlight can discolor plastic covers if the cleaner dries on the pieces.

Once everything is rinsed, use compressed air to blow off the water. To make every surface look like new, buy a spray bottle of engine cleaning finishing spray. This is final step that the car agencies perform on those used cars that have engines that look new with shiny hoses, plastic parts, and painted surfaces. Griot's is just one of the companies that makes such a spray. It's called Engine Bay Dressing and you can find it and several others on Amazon and your local auto parts store. Again, just be careful you don't get any overspray on the paint or rinse it off ASAP.

Once the finishing spray is dry, we suggest you fire up the car and bring it up to temperature to ensure any remaining moisture evaporates. Now you are ready to open your hood to display your handywork the next time you go to a show and shine.

Stories of Corvette Racing

As you may have noticed, I've been rather reserved in my predictions for Corvette racing this year. It's a new car competing in series with new regulations and often for teams that are not only new to the car but also new to team ownership. That's a combination of things that you might call "a perfect storm," if you had a tendency towards the dramatic.

Well, children, things are brightening up. May was a good month for Corvette racing teams. First, up the road in Monterey at the iconic Laguna Seca track, the third round of the WeatherTech Sports Car Championship was run on May 12 with the Pratt Miller Corvette Racing team competing in the GTD Pro class with two cars (#'s 3 & 4), and AWA team in the GTD class running one car (#13).

The weekend started off well for Pratt Miller with Nicky Catsburg putting the #4 Z06 GT3.R on the pole with the #3 not far behind, neatly taking the whole front row! When the flag dropped for the race itself Catsburg put his car in the lead and Antonio Garcia's #4 was right behind in second place. The two Corvettes consistently ran within one second of each other and by the time the first pit stops were scheduled the #4 and #3 had stretched out a three second lead over the



third place car. Catsburg pitted and turned the driving chores over to Tommy Milner, but a small glitch in the stop dropped Milner back to second place.

The #3 car, running sixth as the pit stop cycle began, got caught up by a full-course yellow flag, but the pit stop went well and with Alexander Sims now behind the wheel it re-entered the race in seventh place, but stuck amongst the slower GTD cars.

The final set of pit stops went well, with the #3 Corvette picking up two positions when it re-entered the race. The #4 car inherited the lead with the last round of stops and re-entered the race in second before being passed by the eventual class winner. The



race ended with the #4 car on the podium in third place and the #3 car in fifth.

In the GTD class the AWA #13 had raced its way into the top ten but then finished eleventh in class after having received a drive-through penalty due to a pitman infraction. Nonetheless, #13 won the Bob Akin Award, which goes to the highest-finishing GTD entry with a Bronze driver. (In IMSA, competition licenses have levels denoting expertise and experience, Bronze, Silver, and Gold, and #13's drivers, Orey Fidani and Matthew Bell, both hold Bronze licenses.



The following weekend at Austin, Texas's Circuit of the Americas, DXTX Racing had two Z06 GT3.R Corvettes entered, #8 driven by Bryan Sellers and Scott Smithson, and #63 driven by Tommy Miller (who also drives for Pratt Miller) and Alec Udall. Two races were run on the weekend, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. In both cases the #63 car was the first car across the finish line,

giving the Corvette GT3.R it's first wins in the new era of GT racing. The #63 was simply the fastest car in its class on both days never was seriously challenged. The #8 car had some of the bad luck that has seemed to plague Corvettes on racing circuits this season, when it punctured a tire on the first lap of Sunday's race and eventually came in eleventh.

So in the course of seven days we saw two wins and a third place, which is a strong signal that the Corvette teams have been successful in ironing out the wrinkles any new race car will have. And a real "Tip o' the Hat" to Tommy Milner for playing a key roll in each of the three wins.

Stay tuned, June will see more racing in the States and, at mid-month, the Le Mans 24-Hours. TF Sport will bring two GT3.R's to Le Mans and try to match the success of DXTX and Pratt Miller in an event in which Corvette has traditionally played a prominent role. Things are getting exciting for us Corvette lovers, so keep your fingers crossed and think good thoughts as June nears.

In June Corvettes will be racing in Detroit and Watkins Glen in the WeatherTech Sports Car Championship and at Le Mans in the World Endurance Championship Series. There are no GT World Challenge America events in June.

The Detroit Grand Prix is slated for Friday, May 31 and Saturday, June 1.

The 6-Hours at Watkins Glen will take place June 27-30.

Le Mans begins on Wednesday, June 12 with qualifying and practice, while the 24-Hours kicks off on Saturday, June 15 and ends the following day, twenty-four hours later.

The next GT World Challenge America race is scheduled at Virginia International Raceway for July 19-21.


